Baking Your Friendship Bread

INGREDIENTS

1 cup Friendship Bread Starter mix

3 eggs

1 cup oil

½ cup milk

1 cup sugar

½ teaspoon vanilla

2 teaspoons cinnamon

1½ teaspoon baking powder

½ teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon baking soda

2 cups flour

1 small box vanilla instant pudding

1 cup nuts chopped (optional)

1 cup raisins (optional)

INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat oven to 325° F (165° C).

- In a large mixing bowl, add ingredients as listed.
- Grease two large loaf pans.
- Dust the greased pans with a mixture of $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar and $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoons cinnamon.
- Pour the batter evenly into loaf or cake pans and sprinkle the remaining cinnamon-sugar mixture on the top.
- Bake for one hour or until the bread loosens evenly from the sides and a toothpick inserted in the center of the bread comes out clean.


Instructions for reporting Work Orders.....
