### Caramel Pumpkin Dip - Makes 2-1/2 cups

#### Ingredients

- 4 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1/2 cup canned pumpkin
- 1/3 cup caramel ice cream topping
- 1/4 cup sour cream
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

### Directions



1. In a small bowl, beat cream cheese and confectioners' sugar until smooth. Gradually add the pumpkin, caramel topping, sour cream, cinnamon and nutmeg, beating until smooth. Serve with dippers (cookies, vanilla wafers, graham crackers, fruit, etc.) of your choice. Refrigerate leftovers.



### **Thanksgiving Facts and Trivia**

- 1. Thanksgiving Day is celebrated on the fourth Thursday in November in the United States.
- 2. By the fall of 1621 only half of the pilgrims who had sailed on the Mayflower, survived. The survivors, thankful to be alive, decided to give a thanksgiving feast.
- 3. The Plymouth Pilgrims were the first to celebrate the Thanksgiving.
- 4. The pilgrims arrived in North America in December 1620.
- 5. The Pilgrims sailed across the Atlantic Ocean to reach North America.
- 6. The pilgrims sailed on the ship, which was known by the name of 'Mayflower'.
- 7. They celebrated the first Thanksgiving Day in the fall of 1621.
- 8. Thanksgiving became a national, US holiday 200 years later, by President Lincon in 1863. The campaign to make it a national holiday by sending letters lasted for 17 long years. Credit goes to Sarah Josepha Hale, the lady, who also wrote the popular song "Mary had a Little Lamb."
- 9. The pilgrims did not serve pumpkin pie. Rather, they made stewed pumpkin at the first Thanksgiving feast.
- 10. They celebrated the first Thanksgiving Day at Plymouth, Massachusetts.
- 11. The drink that the Puritans brought with them in the Mayflower was beer.
- 12. The Wampanoag Indians were the people who taught the Pilgrims how to cultivate the land.
- 13. The first Thanksgiving feast was held in the presence of around ninety Wampanoag Indians and the Wampanoag chief, Massasoit, was also invited there.
- 14. The first Thanksgiving celebration lasted three days.
- 15. President George Washington issued the first national Thanksgiving Day Proclamation in the year 1789 and again in 1795.
- 16. The state of New York officially made Thanksgiving Day an annual custom in 1817.
- 17. It has been estimated that 88% of Americans eat turkey at Thanksgiving.
- 18. The famous Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade began in the 1920's.
- 19. About 46 million turkeys are eaten in America for Thanksgiving dinner.
- 20. The state of California consumes the most amount of turkey.

## **Know Your Winter Weather Terms**

## Winter Storm Warning

Issued when hazardous winter weather in the form of heavy snow, heavy freezing rain, or heavy sleet is imminent or occurring. Winter Storm Warnings are usually issued 12 to 24 hours before the event is expected to begin.

### Winter Storm Watch

Alerts the public to the possibility of a blizzard, heavy snow, heavy freezing rain, or heavy sleet. Winter Storm Watches are usually issued 12 to 48 hours before the beginning of a Winter Storm.

## Winter Weather Advisory

Issued for accumulations of snow, freezing rain, freezing drizzle, and sleet which will cause significant inconveniences and, if caution is not exercised, could lead to life-threatening situations.
