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### Crescent Topped Cheeseburger

1 lb. or more hamburger  
browned with ¼ C. chopped  
onion, drain

Add: ¼ cup chopped dill pickles  
or pickle relish

½ cup water

½ cup catsup

1 T. Mustard

1/8 t. pepper

Put into baking dish, sprinkle top  
with 1 ½ cups shredded  
Mozzarella Cheese, cover top  
with 1 - 8 oz. can of crescent  
rolls, brush with egg.
