Some Winter Weather Safety Tips

Stay off roads if at all possible. Keep a winter survival kit in your vehicle if you must travel. If trapped in your car, then stay inside.

Reduce the risk of a heart attack by avoiding overexertion when shoveling snow and walking in the snow. You can do some light stretching exercise indoors before shoveling.

Be prepared for weather-related emergencies, including power outages. Stock food that needs no cooking or refrigeration and water stored in clean containers. Stay informed. Catch the latest weather and road conditions before heading out. Be aware of ice on sidewalks, parking lots and driveways.

Limit your time outside. If you need to go outside, then wear layers of warm clothing. Watch for signs of frostbite and hypothermia, including shivering, exhaustion, confusion, and slurred speech.

Stay dry in the cold because moisture or dampness, e.g., from sweating, can increase the rate of heat loss from the body.

Eat regularly, as food provides the body with energy for producing its own heat. Foods rich in vitamin D like mushrooms, eggs and salmon can boost your mood and decrease the impulse to eat based on mood.

Getting nutrients like vitamin C, B and D from your food can help you fight off those common winter colds.

Beginning January 1, 2024, all cats and dogs need to be registered and licensed.

This is done at the Fremont Municipal Building, 400 E Military - 2nd floor.

You must take current rabies shot record receipt and/or tag to the FHA Office to be copied, when you receive them.

Fun Facts About Winter

- * You can see your breath when it's below 45 degrees Fahrenheit. You breathe in oxygen, and your exhale has water vapor, which allows the visual in the cold temperatures.
- * The first Winter Olympics occurred in 1924 in the French Alps.
- Like birds, whales, bats, and caribou, monarch butterflies also migrate to warmer climates escaping the Winter weather.
- * During the winter season, the North Pole has an average temperature of minus 40 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Guinness World Records reports the largest snowflake (15" in diameter and 8" thick) had fallen during a storm in January 1887 at Fort Keogh.
- Snow blindness happens after too much ultra violet light and causes temporary pain.
- Snowflakes are translucent. They do not change colors unless it's a case of Watermelon Snow. Watermelon snow is a natural phenomenon that turns snow a pink or red hue. It is caused by a type of green algae called *Chlamydomonas nivalis* that thrives in cold, snowy environments.
- The history of the snowman dates back to the 1400's when local artist, including Michael Angelo, considered snow to be free art supplies.

RENT

- The rent is due on the 1st and late after the close of business the 5th day of each month.

- If the 5th falls on Sunday, the rent must be in the drop box before 8:00 a.m. of the 6th.
- If the rent is not paid on or before the 5th day of the month, a *late payment charge* will be applied as follows: \$30.00 will be assessed for payments made on the 6th through the 20th day of the month.
- Payments made on the 21st day and after will be assessed at the rate of an additional \$20.00 charge.
- This late charge is immediately due as an addition to that month's rent and must be paid before that month's rent will be considered to be paid in full.


