4th of July Fun Facts

- On July 4, 1776, the newly independent U.S. only had a population of 2.5 million, today there's over 314 million.
- The Declaration of Independence was signed by 56 men who represented the 13 colonies.
- Philadelphia witnessed the very first 4th of July fireworks in 1777.
- In the U.S., 33 places bear the word "liberty" in their names.
- At 26 years old, Edward Rutledge was the youngest to sign the document.
- Benjamin Franklin was 70 years old when he signed, therefore he is the oldest.
- In 1870, the U.S. Congress voted to make the 4th of July a federal holiday.
- Both the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution were signed in Philadelphia.
- There have been 27 versions of the U.S. flag.
- The first person to sign the Declaration of Independence was John Hancock.
- 3 of the Founding Fathers and U.S. Presidents died on the 4th of July.
- Calvin Coolidge was the only U.S. President born on the 4th of July.
- The Liberty Bell rings 13 times every 4th of July in honor of the 13 original states.
- Americans consume approximately 150 million hotdogs on every 4th of July.
- Since 2014, Americans splurge over \$1 billion on fireworks every 4th of July.
- The Continental Congress voted for independence on July 2, 1776.
- The Star Spangled Banner became the United States' national anthem in 1931.
- Coney Island, New York, hosts a famous, televised hot-dog-eating contest every year on July 4th.
- In 2024 a study showed around 64% of Americans owned a U.S. flag.
- Fireworks can get 15 times hotter than the boiling point of water.
- Six American flags have made it to the moon.
- "America" by Ray Charles is the most played song on the 4th of July.
- The Pledge of Allegiance has been changed four times.
- The shortest 4th of July parade is in Aptos, California. It's just a half mile long.

Chocolate Peanut Butter Pie

Ingredients

For the Crust:

25 chocolate sandwich cookies, such as Oreos

5 Tbsp. salted butter, melted

For the Filling:

1 cup creamy peanut butter

1 (8 oz.) package cream cheese, softened

1 1/4 cups powdered sugar

8 oz. whipped topping, such as Cool Whip, thawed

Directions

For the crust: Preheat the oven to 350°F.

Crush the cookies using a food processor or smash in a plastic

bag. Transfer them to a bowl and pour the melted butter over the top. Stir with a fork to combine. Press the cookie mixture firmly into the bottom and up the sides of a pie plate. Bake until set, 5 to 7 minutes. Remove from the oven and allow to cool completely.

For the filling: Use a mixer or wire whisk to beat the peanut butter with the cream cheese until combined. Add the powdered sugar and beat until smooth. Add the thawed whipped topping and beat until smooth. Pour the filling into the crust, evening out the top with a knife or spatula. Chill for at least 4 hours before serving.






Instructions for reporting Work Orders.....
