#### **SNAP BENEFITS**



The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) will be again be issuing emergency supplemental allotments

to Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients who receive benefits for the month of June on July 7th. The increased benefits will be loaded directly on your SNAP card if you are a SNAP

recipient. The benefits are shown below. If you already receive the maximum amount then you will not receive additional benefits

# FIRST ROUND STIMULUS PAYMENT ON A DEBIT CARD



The Treasury Department has distributed stimulus checks by direct deposit and paper checks. The Treasury Department has begun mailing a debit card to households without bank accounts or taxpayers who do not receive tax refunds via direct deposit. The cards can be used for store purchases, transfer to bank accounts without any fees, or to get cash from an ATM.

Many people have reported mistaking them for junk mail and throwing them away. If you have thrown yours away by mistake or if the name is not correct you can contact:

IRS at 1-800-240-8100 to get a free replacement card.

The \$7.50 processing fee will be waived for the first reissuance of the Economic Impact Payments (EPI) debit card.

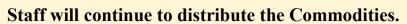

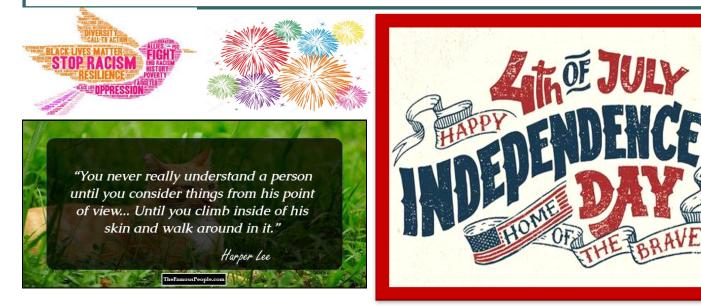
## **FARMERS MARKET COUPONS**

Older Nebraskans meeting income and age guidelines are eligible to receive \$48.00 in coupons that can be exchanged for fresh produce sold at SFMNP certified Nebraska Framers Market stands. You must be 60 or older and have an annual income of less than \$23,606 for a single person and less than \$31,894 for two person household. Only one coupon per household.

First you must request and fill out an application form and bring the application to the coupon distribution site. I am assuming for you that will be Christensen Field. To receive an application you will have to call the senior center at 402 727-2815. The application will be mailed to you with instructions for how and when to pick up coupons. A curbside pickup for coupon distribution will be used at most locations. You must bring the completed application with you when you pick up your coupons.

The amount of coupons to be distributed are limited-not everyone requesting a coupon or filling out an application will receive coupons. Having an application does not guarantee coupons.

If you are interested you should get your application as soon as possible before the allocation runs out. First come First serve.
