October 28th sets aside National First Responders Day to honor the men and women who act quickly when an emergency is at hand.

First responders dedicate their lives to save lives. They are firefighters, police, emergency medical technicians (EMT), paramedics, and 911 operators. In an emergency, they're the first on the scene. These dedicated professionals answer the call when a crisis arises, often putting their own lives on the line.

Serving as a national day of gratitude, we pay tribute to their endless hours and around the clock service provided to their communities. As one of the most dangerous jobs in the country, the day also pays tribute to the fallen first responders. According to the CDC, 97 firefighters and 155 police officers die each year in the line of duty. Additionally, their rate of occupational injury is higher than the national average. Often, the very people saving lives are our neighbors, friends and family members. And their families know the price they pay for their dedication to the job.

HOW TO OBSERVE #NationalFirstRespondersDay

The day provides you with an opportunity to recognize a first responder in your life. You might be surprised at how many you know. If their service is voluntary, you may only know about their day job. Be supportive of their family. Support programs that improve services to first responders. Connect with a first responder who came to your rescue and thank them. Let them know you appreciate their dedication and sacrifice.

NATIONAL FIRST RESPONDERS DAY HISTORY

In 2019, the United States Senate passed a resolution designating October 28th as National First Responders Day to honor the men and women putting their lives on the line. Additionally, many states have proclaimed October 28th as National First Responders Day and others recognize the observance on different dates throughout the year.



Announcements & Helpful Ideas

- ♦ A **Safety Flag** placed on your motorized wheelchair helps to increase visibility for drivers and pedestrians and can help to reduce accidents. A flag will help to alert others of your approach. A flag should be at least 6 feet off the wheelchair/scooter, and are recommended for all mobility wheelchair/scooter users.

- ♦ Be sure to give yourself a little extra time when planning to use the Community Rooms & Solariums so that you have time to **clean up after yourself**. A healthy and positive attitude to have in life is "leave it better than you found it." Meaning that no matter what situation, place, or job you are a part of, you should always add value to it and leave it better (or the same) than you found it.
- ♦ Please be mindful of **good habits when doing your laundry** in public areas. Be sure to sort your laundry **at home** prior to going into the laundry room. By doing so you will identify melted or leaked items, and items that are not wash machine soluble. Should you happen to find melted or leaked items, soak those items **at home and before putting them in the machines**. Another good rule of thumb is when loading the clothes into the dryer, **fluff each piece of clothing by giving it a quick shake**. The clothes will dry more quickly and with fewer wrinkles.
