GOOD NEIGHBOR GUIDELINES & SUGGESTIONS

Are you a good neighbor? Do you respect your neighbor's right to a peaceful environment? Do you treat your neighbors the way you want to be treated? Respect works both ways; if you give it, you will get it.

- Introduce yourself as soon as you can.
- spread rumors and do not listen to rumors.
- 8:00 at night. It can wait until the next day.
- Regularly mow the lawn if it's your responsibility.
- 10:00 a.m.

Keep noise at a reasonable volume at all times. If you can hear noise coming from your neighbor's apartment, it is likely they can hear you too; do not drop or throw trash, cigarette butts, etc. in the yard; do not

Getting on the "noisy neighbor" list with apartment management isn't a good thing. There is no reason to hammer a nail on a common wall that you share with the apartment next door past

Sitting outside on a warm summer night with your spouse or friend is wonderful, but if your house is on a small lot, and the neighbor's bedroom window is close, it's rude to hold a long conversation on the back

If you have an issue with a neighbor, go directly to that person and discuss it in an adult manner. Don't

Not everyone is a dog or cat lover, so show responsibility for your pets. Keep them off the neighbor's

Obey noise ordinance laws. If a neighbor calls or comes over and asks you to pipe down, be friendly and

Be reminded, you are responsible for the actions of all household members, visitors, and guests. Ask your guests to park in the driveway or in front of your house. Make sure they don't block someone else's drive-
