Especially Good Carrot
Casserole
1 lb. carrots, sliced

1 can cream of celery soup
1 med. onion chopped
3 T. margarine
1 cup grated cheddar cheese
1 cup stuffing mix, crumbled
Cook carrots until tender, drain,
sauté onion in margarine, add
carrots, soup, and cheese. Put in
casserole dish and sprinkle
stuffing on top. Bake @ 350 for
30 minutes.

Out of this World Pie (makes two) 1-20 oz. can cherry pie filling 1-20 oz. can crushed pineapple ¾ cup sugar 1 T. cornstarch 1 t. red food coloring 1-3 oz. pkg. raspberry Jello 6 bananas sliced 1 C. chopped pecans 2-10" baked pie shells Whipped topping In sauce pan combine pie filling, sugar, pineapple and juice, cornstarch, and coloring. Cook till thick. Remove from heat and add Jello. Allow to cool-add bananas and pecans, pour into pie shells and top with topping. Refrigerate.
