PET LICENSE

On or after the second day of January you can renew your pet license for 2022.

Cost is \$10.00 for spayed or neutered pet and \$15.00 if they are not spayed or neutered.

There will be a \$5.00 late fee if not licensed by February 1st.

A pet license may be obtained from the City Clerks office, 2nd floor, Municipal Building, 400 East Military and from participating area veterinarians.

Please be sure to provide your Housing Specialist with verification of your new Pet License no later than January 31st



Take you dog outside for bathroom breaks, as there are no exceptions to the Pet Policy and Potty Pads are prohibited.

Unless you are an avid skier or a Siberian Husky, winter may not be the easiest time to go outside, but do not get cooped up with your pup! Regular time outside gives your furry friend exposure to fresh air, the valuable source of vitamin D, and outside stimulation to keep them from getting restless or bored. Spending time outdoors in the sun will give your pooch an extra boost of Vitamin D, which is vital for bone health.

Tips to determine when to use the 9-1-1 emergency line

A good rule of thumb is to only dial 9-1-1 when there is an immediate risk to life or property

Some examples are:

- Any medical emergency
- Wellness check for a friend or neighbor
- Any crime involving weapons (guns, knives, clubs, etc.)
- Domestic violence, in-progress, or threatened
- Fire of any kind



- 1. Location of the problem
- 2. Type of problem: The Dispatcher will ask for a basic description of what occurred and, if applicable, when the incident happened.
- 3. Give the dispatcher all of the information available: Do not leave out information because you don't think that it is important.
- 4. Medical Emergencies Initial: During the call the dispatcher will ask for information about the patient that is helpful to the paramedics.
