I found that there are more than 10 recommendations for many kinds of systems, they very in what services are provided with them, including GPS that works no matter where you are, or there are some that only work within so many feet of your telephone. They also vary in initial cost, and monthly service fees, and it stated that some supplemental insurances will pay the initial cost and the fees are minimal depending on the service. If you have thought of getting this service, contact your

insurance carrier, have a family member call for you, or go online and see what's available. A minimal fee each month is far cheaper than a fall, a broken bone, on laying without being able to call for help. Your safety is important to those who love you.
